Presentation of the Special Issue:

The proposed special issue will contain contributions from scientists in the fields of perceptual-motor control, skill acquisition and related research areas. Submissions are encouraged to reflect a *New* perspective that has the potential to stimulate original directions in the field of Expertise research. It is anticipated that submissions will focus on a research topic where a consensus of opinion has not yet been reached. Each submission will require the author(s) to detail how their perspective offers new conceptual, theoretical and research directions.

Two different types of manuscript can be submitted as part of the Special Issue:

- **Original Research Articles** - These articles should comprise of completely original experimental material. Author guidance can be found at the following link <https://www.mov-sport-sciences.org/author-information/instructions-for-authors>
- **Opinion Piece** - where possible, the format of each Opinion Piece article will be standardised, adhering to the following structure as close as possible:
 - An introduction to the research topic;
 - A section defining key concepts of the new perspective;
 - A review of literature that underpins the new perspective;
 - The implications for future research;
 - Reference section

The proposed Special Issue will contain between 8 and 12 submissions. We envisage that each submission will be 44,000 characters, maximum which equates to an approximate length of 25 pages, excluding references. Submissions can include up to 5 figures/tables.
